Ever felt the sting of favoritism? A majority of hiring managers believe attractive candidates get hired more easily. Folks considered "too overweight" or "too old" also have a harder time getting work. Sometimes it seems like the coach's kid gets *all* playing time, right? Our world is a world of judgment.

But God's kingdom operates differently. James (James 2:1-17) says to us, "Brothers and sisters, as believers in our glorious Lord Jesus Christ, do not show favoritism." James is calling the church to be *just*. He gives an example: imagine two unknown men come to worship. One has shabby clothes, unshaved face, and smells a little "off." The other guy is immaculate in his three-piece suit, glimmering shoes, and pocket square.

What assumptions would you have on meeting these men? Whom would you prefer in the pew next to you? While tempted to judge by externals, James says that church doesn't play favorites.

Acts 6 gives an example from the very first church (Jerusalem, AD 33). They had a *help fund* for destitute members. What could go wrong? Well, the *Hebrew-speaking* members and *Greek-speaking* members got upset with each other. The Greek-speakers said, "Hey! We're being overlooked; there's unfair favoritism going on!" So the Apostles appointed seven new leaders (the very first Deacons) to oversee the help fund. Each of the new Deacons was themselves a *Greek-speaker*. Those folks had been overlooked, so the Apostles *made sure* they had a say in things going forward. That's justice.

James also calls us to *mercy*, having compassion on those in need. He says we can wish a needy fellow Christian well without offering any physical help at all, our faith is probably on life-support (James 2:14-17).

Emily and Billy Lewis' faith is certainly alive! When they were engaged, the COVID-19 pandemic put a damper on their plans for a large wedding meal. They settled for a small ceremony at city hall. But having canceled their venue, they were still committed to a \$5,000 catering deposit! Rather than suing for their money back, they asked the caterer for a special order: hundreds of Thanksgiving meals for clients of a local mental health center. That's compassion.

Just and merciful. That's like Christ for us, who in justice took the penalty of our sin that we might receive the mercy of God. And he says: *Come, follow me*.

At its February 11, 2025 meeting, FPC's Session approved a <u>new</u> <u>Building & Grounds Use Policy</u>. The process outlined in this new policy is that all parties requesting use of the Church facilities must contact the Church Office for discussion of said use. Upon approval of such use, a "Rental Agreement" must be completed and signed, a deposit of \$250.00 must be submitted if required, and "Checklist of Building and Grounds Rentals" must be received by the person making the request. The \$250.00 deposit will be retained by the Church Office and returned to the party requesting the use of FPC facilities once the "Checklist of Building and Grounds Rentals" is returned to the Office and it is determined that the reserved area of use is left in the original condition and guidelines were followed in the "Rental Agreement". If you have any questions about the new policy, please contact the Church Office. The <u>Synodwide Gathering of Presbyterian Women</u> is scheduled for June 12-15, 2025 in Watertown, SD. Registration is now open with the registration fee of \$150.00 which includes all meals, even snack breaks; up to eight (8) workshops from inspiring leaders; group presentations; shopping; a program book; book groups; mission opportunities; guest speakers; a Gathering choir; and much more.
